the secret counsels which govern God in dealing with the righteous, Mysteries refer to the deep counsels of God hitherto secret, but now revealed. Have supernatural wisdom so as to understand all the secrets of God. And all knowledge. Insight into the deeper meanings of Scripture

I CORINTHIANS 13:2

2 And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries, and all knowledge; and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, and have not charity, I am nothing.

The word "charity" means "love" in action. It is not simply an emotion; it is the heart reaching out to others. "Charity" today makes us think of giving away old clothes or making gifts to "charitable institutions. "

These activities can be Christian love in action, but Paul is demanding much more. The word he uses for love is agape, which is love that sacrifices for the good of others.

I CORINTHIANS 13:3

3 And though I bestow all my goods to feed the poor, and though I give my body to be burned, and have not charity, it profiteth me nothing.

Even self-sacrifice can be self-centered

I CORINTHIANS 13:4

4 Charity suffereth long, and is kind; charity envieth not; charity *VAUNTETH not itself, is not *PUFFED up.

VAUNTETH: perpereuomai {per-per-yoo'-om-ahee} to boast one's self; a self display, employing rhetorical embellishments in extolling one's self excessively

PUFFED: phusioo {foo-see-o'-o}

to inflate, blow up, to cause to swell up; to puff up, make proud; to be puffed up, to bear one's self loftily, be proud

Is not inflated with a sense of its own importance; for it knows it has nothing but what it has received; and that it deserves nothing that it has got. Every man, whose heart is full of the love of God, is full of humility. Pride is the very essence of sin; he who has sin has pride, and pride too in proportion to his sin.

True humility arises from a sense of the fullness of God in the soul

I CORINTHIANS 13:5

5 Doth not behave itself unseemly, seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil;

Doth not behave itself unseemly, It means, to conduct improperly, or disgracefully, or in a manner to deserve reproach. Love seeks that which is proper or becoming in the circumstances and relations of life in which we are placed.

It prompts to the due respect for superiors, producing veneration and respect for their opinions; and it prompts to a proper regard for inferiors, not despising their rank, their poverty, their dress, their dwellings, their pleasures, their views of happiness;

it prompts to the due observance of all the relations of life, as those of a husband, wife, parent, child, brother, sister, son, daughter, and produces a proper conduct and deportment in all these relations.

Seeketh not her own; that is, her own praise, profit, or pleasure; it seeketh it not injuriously, either in the neglect of others, or to the hurt of others. Charity is not selfish, but generous.
