CHARACTER TRAITS OF A GODLY MAN III

I CORINTHIANS 7:1

1 ¶ Now concerning the things whereof ye wrote unto me: It is good for a man not to *TOUCH a woman.

TOUCH: haptomai {hap'-tom-ahee} to fasten one's self to, adhere to, cling to, carnal intercourse with a women or cohabitation

I CORINTHIANS 7:2

2 Nevertheless, to avoid fornication, let every man have his own wife, and let every woman have her own husband.

I CORINTHIANS 7:3

3 Let the husband render unto the wife due benevolence: and likewise also the wife unto the husband.

I CORINTHIANS 7:4

4 The wife hath not power of her own body, but the husband: and likewise also the husband hath not power of his own body, but **the wife.**

I CORINTHIANS 7:5

5 Defraud ye not one the other, except it be with consent for a time, that ye may give yourselves to fasting and prayer; and come together again, that Satan tempt you not for your incontinency.

I CORINTHIANS 7:3

3 Let the husband render unto the wife due benevolence: and likewise also the wife unto the husband.

"Let the husband render unto the wife due benevolence; and likewise also the wife unto the husband". The Greek word translated <u>"render"</u> signified not the granting of a favor

but <u>the discharge of an obligation</u>. When a couple are married, they have an obligation, a duty, to attend to the sexual desires of their spouse.

I CORINTHIANS 7:3

3 Let the husband render unto the wife due *BENEVOLENCE: and likewise also the wife unto the husband.

BENEVOLENCE Greek: opheile

Only here and Eph 6:7. It means that the wife and husband must respect each other regarding lawful sexual needs, mutually satisfying each other. If they do not obey this injunction **one** may be responsible for the other's infidelity.

Marriage takes away from persons that power which they had over themselves and their own bodies, and transfers it in some sort to the person they are married to.

I CORINTHIANS 7:4

4 The wife hath not power of her own body, but the husband: and likewise also the husband hath not power of his own body, but the wife.

"In wedlock separate ownership of the person ceases"

I CORINTHIANS 7:4

4 The wife hath not power of her own body, but the husband: and likewise also the husband hath not power of his own body, but the wife.

"The wife cannot claim her body as her own; it is her husband's. Equally, the husband cannot claim his body as his own; it is his wife's." The body of each belongs to the other, and cannot be yielded to other parties. The spirit of the passage not only forbids adultery, but polygamy.

I CORINTHIANS 7:5

5 Defraud ye not **one the other**, except it be with consent for a time, that ye may give yourselves to fasting and prayer; and come together again, that Satan tempt you not for your incontinency.

EPHESIANS 5:28

28 So ought men to love their wives as their own bodies. He that loveth his wife loveth himself.

GENESIS 2:21

21 ¶ And the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall upon Adam, and he slept: and he took one of his ribs, and closed up the flesh instead thereof;

GENESIS 2:22

22 And the rib, which the LORD God had taken from man, made he a woman, and brought her unto the man.

GENESIS 2:23

23 And Adam said, This is now bone of my bones, and flesh of my flesh: she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of Man.

GENESIS 2:24

24 Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh.

GENESIS 3:16

16 ¶ Unto the woman he said, I will **greatly multiply thy sorrow and thy conception**; in sorrow thou shalt bring forth children; and thy ***DESIRE** shall be to thy husband, and he shall ***RULE** over thee.

DESIRE: tshuwqah {tesh-oo-kaw'} longing, craving, of woman for man

RULE: mashal {maw-shal'} have dominion, reign, to exercise dominion

GENESIS 3:17

17 ¶ And unto Adam he said, **Because thou hast** hearkened unto the voice of thy wife, and hast eaten of the tree, of which I commanded thee, saying, Thou shalt not eat of it: cursed is the ground for thy sake; in sorrow shalt thou eat of it all the days of thy life;

GENESIS 3:18

18 Thorns also and thistles shall it bring forth to thee; and thou shalt eat the herb of the field;

GENESIS 3:19

19 In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground; for out of it wast thou taken: for dust thou art, and unto dust shalt thou return.

I CORINTHIANS 14:34

34 ¶ Let your women keep silence in the churches: for it is not permitted unto them to speak; but they are commanded to be under obedience, as also saith the law.

I CORINTHIANS 14:35

35 And if they will learn anything, let them ask their husbands at home: for it is a shame for women to speak in the church.

I CORINTHIANS 14:36

36 ¶ What? came the word of God out from you? or came it unto you only?

I CORINTHIANS 14:37

37 If any man think himself to be a prophet, or spiritual, let him acknowledge that the things that I write unto you are the commandments of the Lord.

I CORINTHIANS 14:38

38 But if any man be ignorant, let him be ignorant.

EPHESIANS 5:22

22 Wives, ***SUBMIT** yourselves unto your own husbands, as unto the Lord.

SUBMIT: hupotasso {hoop-ot-as'-so} put under, be subject unto, to arrange under, to subordinate; to subject, put in subjection; to subject one's self, obey; to submit to one's control; to yield to one's admonition or advice;

A Greek military term meaning "to arrange [troop divisions] in a military fashion under the command of a leader". In non- military use, it was "a voluntary attitude of giving in, cooperating, assuming responsibility, and carrying a burden".

EPHESIANS 5:23

23 For the husband is the ***HEAD** of the wife, even as Christ is the head of the church: and he is the saviour of the body.

HEAD: kephale {kef-al-ay'}

Metaph. anything supreme, chief, prominent; of persons, master lord: of a husband in relation to his wife; of Christ the lord of the husband and the Church; of things, the corner stone

EPHESIANS 5:24

24 Therefore as the church is subject unto Christ, **so let** the wives be to their own husbands in everything.

COLOSSIANS 3:18

18 ¶ Wives, **submit yourselves** unto your own husbands, as it is fit in the Lord.

COLOSSIANS 3:19

19 Husbands, love your wives, and be not bitter against them.

I TIMOTHY 2:11

11 Let the woman learn in silence with all subjection.

I TIMOTHY 2:12

12 But I suffer not a woman to teach, nor to usurp authority over the man, but to be in silence.

women are not to teach in the church; **for that is an act of power and authority**, and supposes the persons that teach to be of a superior degree, and in a superior office, and to have superior abilities to those who are taught by them:

usurp authority--"to lord it over the man"

I TIMOTHY 2:12

12 But I suffer not a woman to teach, nor to usurp authority over the man, but to be in silence.

but to be in silence; to sit and hear quietly and silently, and learn, and not teach,

I TIMOTHY 2:13

13 For Adam was first formed, then Eve.

<u>I TIMOTHY 2:14</u>

14 And Adam was not ***DECEIVED**, but the woman being deceived was in the transgression.

<u>DECEIVED</u>: apatao {ap-at-ah'-o} to cheat, beguile, deceive

II CORINTHIANS 11:3

3 But I fear, lest by any means, as the serpent beguiled Eve through his subtilty, so your minds should be corrupted from the simplicity that is in Christ.

I TIMOTHY 2:14

14 And Adam was not deceived, but the woman being deceived was in the transgression.

I TIMOTHY 2:15

15 Notwithstanding she shall be saved in childbearing, if they continue in faith and charity and holiness with sobriety.

TITUS 2:3

3 The aged women likewise, that they be in behaviour as becometh holiness, not false accusers, not given to much wine, teachers of good things;

TITUS 2:4

4 That they may **teach the young women** to be ***SOBER**, to love their husbands, to love their children,

SOBER: sophronizo {so-fron-id'-zo} restore one to his senses; to moderate, control, curb, disciple; to hold one to his duty; to admonish, to exhort earnestly
