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The word "fiery" is the translation of the Hebrew word saraph which means "burning" and also refers to the angelic creatures (seraphim) who minister before the holy throne of God (Isa 6:2,6).

#### NUMBERS 21:7

7 Therefore the people came to Moses, and said, We have sinned, for we have spoken against the LORD, and against thee; pray unto the LORD, that he take away the serpents from us. And Moses prayed for the people.

#### NUMBERS 21:8

8 And the LORD said unto Moses, Make thee a fiery serpent, and set it upon a pole: and it shall come to pass, that every one that is bitten, when he looketh upon it, shall live.

Antivenom, is a biological product used in the treatment of venomous bites or stings. First, the venom is "milked" from the snake. Then, it's diluted and injected into a horse or a goat.

The subject animal will undergo an immune response to the venom, producing antibodies against the venom's active molecule which can then be harvested from the animal's blood and used to treat a victim.

As the animal builds up immunity to the venom, the dosage is increased, and the animal creates blood rich in antibodies.

Antibodies are blood proteins created to fight antigens. These antibodies collect in the serum, which is eventually separated from the dark red cells. After the serum has been purified a little more, it's ready to be injected at a moment's notice.
