JOB 1:20

20 ¶ Then Job arose, and rent his mantle, and shaved his head, and fell down upon the ground, and worshipped,

JOB 1:21

21 And said, Naked came I out of my mother's womb, and naked shall I return thither: the LORD gave, and the LORD hath taken away; blessed be the name of the LORD.

JOB 3:1

1 ¶ After this opened Job his mouth, and cursed his day.

JOB 3:2

2 And Job spake, and said,

JOB 3:3

3 Let the day perish wherein I was born, and the night in which it was said, There is a man child conceived.

JOB 2:11

11 ¶ Now when Job's three friends heard of all this evil that was come upon him, they came every one from his own place; Eliphaz the Temanite, and Bildad the Shuhite, and Zophar the Naamathite: for they had made an appointment together to come to mourn with him and to comfort him.

JOB 2:12

12 And when they lifted up their eyes afar off, and knew him not, they lifted up their voice, and wept; and they rent every one his mantle, and sprinkled dust upon their heads toward heaven.

JOB 2:13

13 So they sat down with him upon the ground seven days and seven nights, and none spake a word unto him: for they saw that his grief was very great.

JOB 3:1

1 ¶ After this opened Job his mouth, and cursed his day.

JOB 1:9

9 Then Satan answered the LORD, and said, Doth Job fear God for nought?

JOB 1:10

10 Hast not thou made an hedge about him, and about his house, and about all that he hath on every side? thou hast blessed the work of his hands, and his substance is increased in the land.

JOB 1:11

11 But put forth thine hand now, and touch all that he hath, and **he will curse thee to thy face.**

JOB 2:4

4 And Satan answered the LORD, and said, Skin for skin, yea, all that a man hath will he give for his life.

JOB 2:5

5 But put forth thine hand now, and touch his bone and his flesh, and **he will curse thee to thy face.**

JOB 2:9

9 Then said his wife unto him, Dost thou still retain thine integrity? curse God, and die.

JOB 3:1

1 ¶ After this opened Job his mouth, and cursed his day.

PSALM 139:14

14 I will praise thee; for I am fearfully and wonderfully made: marvellous are thy works; and that my soul knoweth right well.

PSALM 139:15

15 My substance was not hid from thee, when I was made in secret, and curiously wrought in the lowest parts of the earth.

PSALM 139:16

16 Thine eyes did see my substance, yet being unperfect; and in thy book all my members were written, which in continuance were fashioned, when as yet there was none of them.

GALATIANS 5:17

17 For the flesh lusteth against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh: and these are contrary the one to the other: so that ye cannot do the things that ye would.

I PETER 2:11

11 Dearly beloved, I beseech you as strangers and pilgrims, abstain from fleshly lusts, which war against the soul;

JAMES 3:10

10 Out of the same mouth proceedeth blessing and cursing. My brethren, these things ought not so to be.

JOB 3:2

2 And Job spake, and said,

JOB 3:3

3 Let the day perish wherein I was born, and the night in which it was said, There is a man child conceived.

JEREMIAH 20:14

14 ¶ Cursed be the day wherein I was born: let not the day wherein my mother bare me be blessed.

JEREMIAH 20:15

15 Cursed be the man who brought tidings to my father, saying, A man child is born unto thee; making him very glad.

JEREMIAH 20:16

16 And let that man be as the cities which the LORD overthrew, and repented not: and let him hear the cry in the morning, and the shouting at noontide;

JEREMIAH 20:17

17 Because he slew me not from the womb; or that my mother might have been my grave, and her womb to be always great with me.

JEREMIAH 20:18

18 Wherefore came I forth out of the womb to see labour and sorrow, that my days should be consumed with shame?

JOB 3:3

3 Let the day perish wherein I was born, and the night in which it was said, There is a man child conceived.

JOB 3:4

4 Let that day be darkness; let not God regard it from above, neither let the light shine upon it.

JOB 3:5

5 Let darkness and the shadow of death stain it; let a cloud dwell upon it; let the blackness of the day terrify it.

let a cloud dwell upon it; The Hebrew word rendered "a cloud" *ananah* occurs nowhere else in this form. It is the feminine form of the word *anan*, "a cloud," and is used "collectively" to denote "clouds;" that is, clouds piled on clouds; clouds "condensed, impacted, heaped together".

Let the blackness of the day terrify it, the Hebrew word used here and rendered "blackness," *kmryrym*. It is supposed to be derived from the word *kamar*, to be warm, to be hot, to burn,

then it would mean the deadly heats of the day, the dry and sultry blasts which prevail so much in sandy deserts.

JOB 3:6

6 As for that night, let darkness seize upon it; let it not be joined unto the days of the year, let it not come into the number of the months.

JOB 3:9

9 Let the stars of the twilight thereof be dark; let it look for light, but have none; neither let it see the dawning of the day:

JOB 3:10

10 Because it shut not up the doors of my mother's womb, nor hid sorrow from mine eyes.

JOB 3:11

11 ¶ Why died I not from the womb? why did I not give up the ghost when I came out of the belly?

JOB 3:12

12 Why did the knees prevent me? or why the breasts that I should suck?

JOB 3:13

13 For now should I have lain still and been quiet, I should have slept: then had I been at rest,

JOB 4:1

1 ¶ Then Eliphaz the Temanite answered and said,

JOB 4:2

2 If we assay to commune with thee, wilt thou be grieved? but who can withhold himself from speaking?

JOB 4:3

3 Behold, thou hast instructed many, and thou hast strengthened the weak hands.

JOB 4:4

4 Thy words have upholden him that was falling, and thou hast strengthened the feeble knees.

JOB 4:5

5 But now it is come upon thee, and thou faintest; it toucheth thee, and thou art troubled.

JOB 4:6

6 Is not this thy fear, thy confidence, thy hope, and the uprightness of thy ways?

JOB 6:4

4 For the arrows of the Almighty are within me, the poison whereof drinketh up my spirit: the terrors of God do set themselves in array against me.

This is an evident reference here to wounds inflicted by poisoned arrows; and to the burning fever occasioned by such wounds, producing such an intense parching thirst as to dry up all the moisture in the system, stop all the salivary ducts, thicken and inflame the blood, and terminate in raging mania, producing the most terrifying images, from which the patient is relieved only by death.

JOB 19:6

6 Know now that God hath overthrown me, and hath compassed me with his net.

JOB 19:7

7 Behold, I cry out of wrong, but I am not heard: I cry aloud, but there is no judgment.

JOB 19:8

8 ¶ He hath fenced up my way that I cannot pass, and he hath set darkness in my paths.

JOB 19:9

9 He hath stripped me of my glory, and taken the crown from my head.

JOB 19:10

10 He hath destroyed me on every side, and I am gone: and mine hope hath he removed like a tree.

JOB 19:11

11 He hath also kindled his wrath against me, and he counteth me unto him **as one of his enemies**.

JOB 19:12

12 His troops come together, and raise up their way against me, and encamp round about my tabernacle.

JOB 19:13

13 He hath put my brethren far from me, and mine acquaintance are verily estranged from me.

JOB 19:14

14 My kinsfolk have failed, and my familiar friends have forgotten me.

JOB 19:15

15 They that dwell in mine house, and my maids, count me for a stranger: I am an alien in their sight.

JOB 23:8

8 ¶ Behold, I go forward, but he is not there; and backward, but I cannot perceive him:

JOB 23:9

9 On the left hand, where he doth work, but I cannot behold him: he hideth himself on the right hand, that I cannot see him:

JOB 23:10

10 But he knoweth the way that I take: when he hath tried me, I shall come forth as gold.

JOB 23:11

11 My foot hath held his steps, his way have I kept, and not declined.

JOB 23:12

12 Neither have I gone back from the commandment of his lips; I have esteemed the words of his mouth more than my necessary food.

JOB 29:2

2 Oh that I were as in months past, as in the days **when God preserved me;**

JOB 29:3

3 When his candle shined upon my head, and when by his light I walked through darkness;

JOB 29:4

4 As I was in the days of my youth, when the secret of God was upon my tabernacle;

JOB 29:5

5 When the Almighty **was yet with me,** when my children were about me;

JOB 42:1

1 ¶ Then Job answered the LORD, and said,

JOB 42:2

2 I know that thou canst do every thing, and that no thought can be withholden from thee.

JOB 42:3

3 Who is he that hideth counsel without knowledge? therefore have I uttered that I understood not; things too wonderful for me, which I knew not.

JOB 42:4

4 Hear, I beseech thee, and I will speak: I will demand of thee, and declare thou unto me.

JOB 42:5

5 I have heard of thee by the hearing of the ear: but now mine eye seeth thee.

JOB 42:6

6 Wherefore I abhor myself, and repent in dust and ashes.
