According to the Quartermaster General In the Army, it is reported that Moses would have to have had 1500 tons of food each day.

Do you know that to bring that much food each day, two freight trains, each at least a mile long, would be required!

Besides you must remember, they were out in the desert, so they would have to have firewood, This would take 4000 tons of wood and a few more freight trains, each a mile long, just for one day.

And just think, they were forty years in transit.

They would have to have water. If they only had enough to drink and wash a few dishes, it would take 11,000,000 gallons each day and a freight train with tank cars, 1800 miles long, just to bring water!

They had to get across the Red Sea at night. Now, if they went on a narrow path, double file, the line would be 800 miles long and would require 35 days and nights to get through.

So there had to be a space in the Red Sea, 3 miles wide so that they could walk 5000 abreast to get over in one night.

each time they camped at the end of the day, a campground two-thirds the size of the state of Rhode Island was required, or a total of 750 square miles long.

HEBREWS 3:1

1 Wherefore, holy brethren, partakers of the heavenly calling, consider the Apostle and High Priest of our profession, Christ Jesus;

HEBREWS 3:2

2 Who was faithful to him that appointed him, as also Moses was faithful in all his house.

HEBREWS 3:3

3 For this man was counted worthy of more glory than Moses, inasmuch as he who hath builded the house hath more honour than the house.

Like Jesus, he was born into a godly home at a difficult time in Jewish history, and like Jesus, his life was threatened.

When Moses gave up the treasures of Egypt, it was like Jesus, who became poor that He might share spiritual riches with many (2 Cor 8:9).

Like Jesus, Moses was rejected by his people when he tried to help them the first time (Ex 2:11-15), but he was accepted by them when he came to them the second time. Israel rejected Christ at His first coming, but they will receive Him when He comes again (Zech 12:10-13:1).

Moses was a meek man, and Jesus said, "I am meek and lowly in heart" (Matt 11:28-30).

Moses finished the work God gave him to do (Ex 39:42-43; 40:33) and so did the Son of God (John 17:4).

Before He returned to heaven, Jesus left trained disciples behind to continue the work of world evangelism, and Moses left Joshua and the elders behind to guide the people in the ways of the Lord.

Our Lord's face shone on the Mount of Transfiguration, and Moses' face shone when he came down from meeting God on the mount (Matt 17:2; Ex 34:29-30).

HEBREWS 11:23

23 By faith Moses, when he was born, was hid three months of his parents, because they saw he was a proper child; and they were not afraid of the king's commandment.

HEBREWS 11:24

24 By faith Moses, when he was come to years, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter;

HEBREWS 11:25

25 Choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season;

HEBREWS 11:26

26 Esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt: for he had respect unto the recompence of the reward.

HEBREWS 11:27

27 By faith he forsook Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king: for he endured, as seeing him who is invisible.

HEBREWS 11:28



28 Through faith he kept the passover, and the sprinkling of blood, lest he that destroyed the firstborn should touch them.

HEBREWS 11:29

29 By faith they passed through the Red sea as by dry land: which the Egyptians assaying to do were drowned.
