On Earth, the lightning frequency is approximately 40–50 times a second

or nearly 1. 4 billion flashes per year and the average duration is 0. 2 seconds made up from a number of much shorter flashes (strokes) of around 30 microseconds.

The huge currents rapidly heat the air to roughly 50,000°F about four times hotter than the surface of the sun.

Most of the four million lightning flashes that occur on our planet each day originate from inside thunderclouds,

often just a few miles above our heads, and yet despite decades of research we still don't understand what is happening inside clouds to start the common lightning bolt.

Rain is caused in the following manner. When two portions of air of different temperature, and each saturated with moisture, are intermixed,

the quantity of moisture in the air thus intermixed, in consequence of the decrease of temperature, will be greater than the air will contain in solution, and will be condensed in a cloud or precipitated to the earth.

JOB 38:28

28 Hath the rain a father? or who hath begotten the drops of dew?

Dew is the moisture condensed from the atmosphere, and that settles on the earth. It usually falls in clear and calm nights, and is caused by a reduction of the temperature of that on which the dew falls.

Objects on the surface of the earth become colder than the atmosphere above them, and the consequence is,

that the moisture that was suspended in the atmosphere near the surface of the earth is condensed in the same way as in a hot day moisture will form on the outside of a tumbler or pitcher that is filled with water.

The coldness of the vessel containing the water condenses the moisture that was suspended in the surrounding atmosphere.
