SONG OF SOLOMON 2:15

15 Take us the foxes, the little foxes, that spoil the vines: for our vines have tender grapes.

NEHEMIAH 4:1

1 ¶ But it came to pass, that when Sanballat heard that we builded the wall, he was wroth, and took great indignation, and mocked the Jews.

NEHEMIAH 4:2

2 And he spake before his brethren and the army of Samaria, and said, What do these feeble Jews? will they fortify themselves? will they sacrifice? will they make an end in a day? will they revive the stones out of the heaps of the rubbish which are burned?

NEHEMIAH 4:3

3 Now Tobiah the Ammonite was by him, and he said, Even that which they build, **if a fox go up, he shall even break down their stone wall**.

18 Because of the mountain of Zion, which is desolate, the foxes walk upon it.

DEUTERONOMY 1:19

19 ¶ And when we departed from Horeb, we went through all that great and terrible wilderness, which ye saw by the way of the mountain of the Amorites, as the LORD our God commanded us; and we came to Kadeshbarnea.

DEUTERONOMY 1:20

20 And I said unto you, Ye are come unto the mountain of the Amorites, which the LORD our God doth give unto us.

DEUTERONOMY 1:21

21 Behold, the LORD thy God hath set the land before thee: **go up and possess it**, as the LORD God of thy fathers hath said unto thee; fear not, **neither be discouraged**.

DEUTERONOMY 1:22

22 And ye came near unto me every one of you, and said, We will send men before us, and they shall search us out the land, and bring us word again by what way we must go up, and into what cities we shall come.

DEUTERONOMY 1:23

23 And the saying pleased me well: and I took twelve men of you, one of a tribe:

DEUTERONOMY 1:24

24 And they turned and went up into the mountain, and came unto the valley of Eshcol, and searched it out.

DEUTERONOMY 1:25

25 And they took of the fruit of the land in their hands, and brought it down unto us, and brought us word again, and said, **It is a good land which the LORD our God doth give us**.

DEUTERONOMY 1:26

26 Notwithstanding ye would not go up, but rebelled against the commandment of the LORD your God:

DEUTERONOMY 1:27

27 And ye murmured in your tents, and said, Because the LORD hated us, he hath brought us forth out of the land of Egypt, to deliver us into the hand of the Amorites, to destroy us.

DEUTERONOMY 1:28

28 Whither shall we go up? **our brethren have discouraged our heart**, saying, The people is greater and taller than we; the cities are great and walled up to heaven; and moreover we have seen the sons of the Anakims there.

NUMBERS 13:26

26 ¶ And they went and came to Moses, and to Aaron, and to all the congregation of the children of Israel, unto the wilderness of Paran, to Kadesh; and brought back word unto them, and unto all the congregation, and shewed them the fruit of the land.

NUMBERS 13:27

27 And they told him, and said, We came unto the land whither thou sentest us, and surely it floweth with milk and honey; and this is the fruit of it.

NUMBERS 13:28

28 Nevertheless the people be strong that dwell in the land, and the cities are walled, and very great: and moreover we saw the children of Anak there.

NUMBERS 13:29

29 The Amalekites dwell in the land of the south: and the Hittites, and the Jebusites, and the Amorites, dwell in the mountains: and the Canaanites dwell by the sea, and by the coast of Jordan.

NUMBERS 13:30

30 And Caleb stilled the people before Moses, and said, Let us go up at once, and possess it; for we are well able to overcome it.

NUMBERS 13:31

31 But the men that went up with him said, We be not able to go up against the people; for they are stronger than we.

NUMBERS 13:32

32 And they brought up an ***EVIL** report of the land which they had searched unto the children of Israel, saying, The land, through which we have gone to search it, is a land that eateth up the inhabitants thereof; and **all the people** that we saw in it are men of a great stature.

NUMBERS 13:33

22 And they ascended by the south, and came unto Hebron; where Ahiman, Sheshai, and Talmai, the children of Anak, were. (Now Hebron was built seven years before Zoan in Egypt.)

NUMBERS 13:33

33 And there we saw the giants, the sons of Anak, which come of the giants: and we were in our own sight as grasshoppers, and so we were in their sight.

DEUTERONOMY 1:29

29 Then I said unto you, Dread not, neither be afraid of them.

DEUTERONOMY 1:30

30 The LORD your God which goeth before you, **he shall fight for you**, according to all that he did for you in Egypt before your eyes;

DEUTERONOMY 1:31

31 And in the wilderness, where thou hast seen how that the LORD thy God bare thee, as a man doth bear his son, in all the way that ye went, until ye came into this place.

DEUTERONOMY 1:32

32 Yet in this thing ye did not believe the LORD your God,

DEUTERONOMY 1:33

33 Who went in the way **before you**, to search you out a place to pitch your tents in, in fire by night, to shew you by what way ye should go, and in a cloud by day.

DEUTERONOMY 1:35

35 Surely there shall not one of these men of this evil generation see that good land, which I sware to give unto your fathers,

DEUTERONOMY 1:36

36 Save Caleb the son of Jephunneh; he shall see it, and to him will I give the land that he hath trodden upon, and to his children, because he hath wholly followed the LORD.

E-17......And little old Elijah he didn't know what to do, so he run to the juniper tree. I'm glad that there is a juniper tree. All God's people needs to go to that juniper tree. It's a place

1 ¶ And Ahab told Jezebel all that Elijah had done, and withal how he had slain all the prophets with the sword.

<u>I KINGS 19:2</u>

2 Then Jezebel sent a messenger unto Elijah, saying, So let the gods do to me, and more also, if I make not thy life as the life of one of them by to morrow about this time.

I KINGS 19:3

3 And when he saw that, he arose, and went for his life, and came to Beersheba, which belongeth to Judah, and left his servant there.

4 But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a juniper tree: and he requested for himself that he might die; and said, It is enough; now, O LORD, take away my life; for I am not better than my fathers.

<u>I KINGS 19:5</u>

5 And as he lay and slept under a juniper tree, behold, then an angel touched him, and said unto him, Arise and eat.

<u>I KINGS 19:6</u>

6 And he looked, and, behold, there was a cake baken on the coals, and a cruse of water at his head. And he did eat and drink, and laid him down again.

<u>I KINGS 19:7</u>

7 And the angel of the LORD came again the second time, and touched him, and said, Arise and eat; because the journey is too great for thee.

<u>I KINGS 19:8</u>

8 And he arose, and did eat and drink, and went in the strength of that meat forty days and forty nights unto Horeb the mount of God.

<u>I KINGS 19:9</u>

9 ¶ And he came thither unto a cave, and lodged there; and, behold, the word of the LORD came to him, and he said unto him, What doest thou here, Elijah?

<u>I KINGS 19:10</u>

10 And he said, I have been very jealous for the LORD God of hosts: for the children of Israel have forsaken thy covenant, thrown down thine altars, and slain thy prophets with the sword; and I, even I only, am left; and they seek my life, to take it away.

NEHEMIAH 4:4

4 Hear, O our God; for we are despised: and turn their reproach upon their own head, and give them for a prey in the land of captivity:

NEHEMIAH 4:5

5 And cover not their iniquity, and let not their sin be blotted out from before thee: for they have provoked thee to anger before the builders.

NEHEMIAH 4:6

6 So built we the wall; and all the wall was joined together unto the half thereof: **for the people had a mind to work.**

NEHEMIAH 4:7

7 ¶ But it came to pass, that when Sanballat, and Tobiah, and the Arabians, and the Ammonites, and the Ashdodites, heard that the walls of Jerusalem were made up, and that the breaches began to be stopped, **then they were very wroth**,

NEHEMIAH 4:8

8 And conspired all of them together to come and to fight against Jerusalem, and to hinder it.

NEHEMIAH 4:9

9 Nevertheless we made our prayer unto our God, and set a watch against them day and night, because of them.

NEHEMIAH 4:10

10 And Judah said, The strength of the bearers of burdens is decayed, and there is much rubbish; so that we are not able to build the wall.

NEHEMIAH 6:1

1 ¶ Now it came to pass, when Sanballat, and Tobiah, and Geshem the Arabian, and the rest of our enemies, heard that I had builded the wall, and that there was no breach left therein; (though at that time I had not set up the doors upon the gates;)

NEHEMIAH 6:2

2 That Sanballat and Geshem sent unto me, saying, Come, let us meet together in some one of the villages in the plain of Ono. But they thought to do me mischief.

NEHEMIAH 6:3

3 And I sent messengers unto them, saying, I am doing a great work, so that I cannot come down: why should the work cease, whilst I leave it, and come down to you?

NEHEMIAH 6:4

4 Yet they sent unto me four times after this sort; and I answered them after the same manner.
