I CORINTHIANS 12:14

14 For the body is not one member, but many.

I CORINTHIANS 12:15

15 If the foot shall say, Because I am not the hand, I am not of the body; is it therefore not of the body?

I CORINTHIANS 12:16

16 And if the ear shall say, Because I am not the eye, I am not of the body; is it therefore not of the body?

I CORINTHIANS 12:17

Based on an adult man's typical volume, you might conclude that the human body contains 15 trillion cells.

Messages from the human brain travel along nerves at up to 200 miles an hour

There are more bacteria in a human mouth than there are people in the world.

A human's little finger contributes over 50% of the hand's strength.

If a human being's DNA were uncoiled, it would stretch 10 billion miles, from Earth to Pluto and back.

For an adult human, taking just one step uses up to 200 muscles

A human skeleton renews itself completely every 10 years.

The body can detect taste in .0015 seconds, which is faster than the blink of an eye.

The brain contains 86 billion nerve cells joined by 100 trillion connections. This is more than the number of stars in the Milky Way.

An adult human body is made up of about 7 octillion atoms.

In an adult human, blood circulates about 12,000 miles a day. This is like traveling from east to west across the widest part of the Pacific Ocean.

A human eye can distinguish between approximately 10 million different colors.

A person takes about 23,040 breaths a day, or about 672,768,000 breaths in a lifetime.

You get a new top layer of skin (epidermis) every 30 days.

CIRCULATORY SYSTEM/CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM

Circulates blood around the body via the heart, arteries and veins, delivering oxygen and nutrients to organs and cells and carrying their waste products away, as well as keeping the body's temperature in a safe range. Your body contains about 60,000 miles of blood vessels.

DIGESTIVE SYSTEM/EXCRETORY (ek-ska-tore) SYSTEM

System to absorb nutrients and remove waste via the gastrointestinal tract, including the mouth, esophagus, stomach and intestines.

ENDOCRINE SYSTEM

Influences the function of the body using hormones.

INTEGUMENTARY (IN-TEG-U-MEN-TA-RY) SYSTEM/EXOCRINE (ek-sa-kren) SYSTEM

System that comprises skin, hair, nails, and sweat and other exocrine glands.

IMMUNE SYSTEM/LYMPHATIC SYSTEM

Defends the body against pathogens that may harm the body. The system contains a network of lymphatic vessels that carry a clear fluid called lymph.

MUSCULAR SYSTEM

Enables the body to move using muscles.

NERVOUS SYSTEM

Collects and processes information from the senses via nerves and the brain and tells the muscles to contract to cause physical actions.

There are nearly 46 miles of nerves in an adult's body.

RENAL SYSTEM/URINARY SYSTEM

The system where the kidneys filter blood to produce urine, and get rid of waste.

REPRODUCTIVE SYSTEM

The reproductive organs required for the production of offspring.

RESPIRATORY SYSTEM

Brings air into and out of the lungs to absorb oxygen and remove carbon dioxide.

SKELETAL SYSTEM

Bones maintain the structure of the body and its organs.

AUTOIMMUNE DISEASES

There are more than 100 autoimmune conditions. These occur when the immune

system mistakenly attacks parts of the human body.

EXODUS 35:30

30 ¶ And Moses said unto the children of Israel, See, the LORD hath called by name Bezaleel the son of Uri, the son of Hur, of the tribe of Judah;

EXODUS 35:31

31 And he hath filled him with the spirit of God, in wisdom, in understanding, and in knowledge, and in all manner of workmanship;

EXODUS 35:32

32 And to devise **curious works**, to work in **gold**, and in **silver**, and in **brass**,

EXODUS 35:33

33 And in the cutting of stones, to set them, and in carving of wood, to make any manner of cunning work.

EXODUS 35:34

34 And he hath put in his heart that he may teach, both he, and Aholiab, the son of Ahisamach, of the tribe of Dan.

EXODUS 35:35

35 Them hath he filled with wisdom of heart, to work all manner of work, of the engraver, and of the cunning workman, and of the embroiderer, in blue, and in purple, in scarlet, and in fine linen, and of the weaver, even of them that do any work, and of those that devise cunning work.

EXODUS 36:1

1 ¶ Then wrought Bezaleel and Aholiab, and every wise hearted man, in whom the LORD put wisdom and understanding to know how to work all manner of work for the service of the sanctuary, according to all that the LORD had commanded.

EXODUS 36:2

2 And Moses called Bezaleel and Aholiab, and every wise hearted man, in whose heart the LORD had put wisdom, even every one whose heart stirred him up to come unto the work to do it:

GOLD 29 talents 730 shekels = 1 1/4 tons

SILVER 100 talents 1,775 shekels = 4 1/4 tons

BRASS 70 talents 2,400 shekels = 4 tons

A talent of gold was about 120 pounds, a talent of silver about 100 pounds, a shekel was one-half ounce.

Adding to this the cost of the wood, fabrics, priestly garments, precious stones, it has been estimated to be valued at \$30 million without labor.

I KINGS 7:13

13 ¶ And king Solomon sent and fetched Hiram out of Tyre.

I KINGS 7:14

14 He was a widow's son of the tribe of Naphtali, and his father was a man of Tyre, a worker in brass: and he was filled with wisdom, and understanding, and cunning to work all works in brass. And he came to king Solomon, and wrought all his work.

I KINGS 7:15

15 For he cast two pillars of brass, of eighteen cubits high apiece: and a line of twelve cubits did compass either of them about.

I KINGS 7:16

16 And he made two chapiters of molten brass, to set upon the tops of the pillars: the height of the one chapter was five cubits, and the height of the other chapter was five cubits:

I KINGS 7:17

17 And nets of checker work, and wreaths of chain work, for the chapiters which were upon the top of the pillars; seven for the one chapter, and seven for the other chapter.

I KINGS 7:18

18 And he made the pillars, and two rows round about upon the one network, to cover the chapiters that were upon the top, with pomegranates: and so did he for the other chapter.

I KINGS 7:19

19 And the chapiters that were upon the top of the pillars were of lily work in the porch, four cubits.

I KINGS 7:20

20 And the chapiters upon the two pillars had pomegranates also above, over against the belly which was by the network: and the pomegranates were two hundred in rows round about upon the other chapter.

I KINGS 7:21

21 And he set up the pillars in the porch of the temple: and he set up the right pillar, and called the name thereof Jachin: and he set up the left pillar, and called the name thereof Boaz.

I KINGS 7:22

22 And upon the top of the pillars was lily work: so was the work of the pillars finished.

I KINGS 7:23

23 And he made a molten sea, ten cubits from the one brim to the other: it was round all about, and his height was five cubits: and a line of thirty cubits did compass it round about.

Excluding the bronze, and using the average current price of gold, the gold alone of Solomon's temple would have been an astonishing \$194,404,500,000.

The silver would have been \$22,199,076,000. Added together, the gold and silver used along in Solomon's Temple was worth \$216,603,576,000.

I CORINTHIANS 12:24
