GETTING IN THE SPIRIT 116

I CORINTHIANS 12:17

17 If the whole body were an eye, where were the hearing? If the whole were hearing, where were the smelling?

I CORINTHIANS 12:18

18 But now hath God **set** the members every one of them in the body, **as it hath pleased him.**

EXODUS 31:2

2 See, I have called by name Bezaleel the son of Uri, the son of Hur, of the tribe of Judah:

EXODUS 31:3

3 And I have filled him with the spirit of God, in wisdom, and in understanding, and in knowledge, **and in all manner of workmanship**,

EXODUS 31:4

4 To devise **cunning works**, to work in gold, and in silver, and in brass,

EXODUS 31:5

5 And in cutting of stones, to set them, and in carving of timber, to work in **all manner of workmanship.**

EXODUS 31:6

6 And I, behold, I have given with him Aholiab, the son of Ahisamach, of the tribe of Dan: **and in the hearts of all that are wise hearted I have put wisdom**, that they may make all that I have commanded thee;

EXODUS 35:34

34 And he hath put in his heart that he may <u>TEACH</u>, **both he, and Aholiab**, the son of Ahisamach, of the tribe of Dan.

EXODUS 36:1

1 ¶ Then wrought Bezaleel and Aholiab, and every wise hearted man, in whom the LORD put wisdom and understanding to know how to work all manner of work for the service of the sanctuary, **according to all that the LORD had commanded**.

EXODUS 36:2

2 And Moses called Bezaleel and Aholiab, and every wise hearted man, in whose heart the LORD had put wisdom, even every one whose heart stirred him up to come unto the work to do it:

GOLD 29 talents 730 shekels = 1 1/4 tons

SILVER 100 talents 1,775 shekels = 4 1/4 tons

BRASS 70 talents 2,400 shekels = 4 tons

A talent of gold was about 120 pounds, a talent of silver about 100 pounds, a shekel was one-half ounce.

Adding to this the cost of the wood, fabrics, priestly garments, precious stones, it has been estimated to be valued at \$30 million without labor.

EXODUS 33:7

7 ¶ And Moses took the tabernacle, and **pitched it without the camp,** afar off from the camp, and called it <u>the</u> <u>Tabernacle of the congregation</u>. And it came to pass, that every one which sought the LORD went out unto the tabernacle of the congregation, which was without the camp.

EXODUS 33:8

8 And it came to pass, when Moses went out unto the tabernacle, that all the people rose up, and stood every man at his tent door, and looked after Moses, until he was gone into the tabernacle.

EXODUS 33:9

9 And it came to pass, as Moses entered into the tabernacle, the cloudy pillar descended, and stood at the door of the tabernacle, and the LORD talked with Moses.

EXODUS 33:10

10 And all the people saw the cloudy pillar stand at the tabernacle door: and all the people rose up and worshipped, every man in his tent door.

EXODUS 33:11

11 And the LORD spake unto Moses face to face, as a man speaketh unto his friend. And he turned again into the camp: but his servant Joshua, the son of Nun, a young man, departed not out of the tabernacle.

EXODUS 33:17

17 And the LORD said unto Moses, I will do this thing also that thou hast spoken: for thou hast found grace in my sight, and I know thee by name.

EXODUS 33:18

18 And he said, I beseech thee, shew me thy glory.

EXODUS 33:19

19 And he said, I will make all my goodness pass before thee, and I will proclaim the name of the LORD before thee; and will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, and will shew mercy on whom I will shew mercy.

EXODUS 33:20

20 And he said, Thou canst not see my face: for there shall no man see me, and live.

EXODUS 33:21

21 And the LORD said, Behold, there is a place by me, and thou shalt stand upon a rock:

EXODUS 33:22

22 And it shall come to pass, while my glory passeth by, that I will put thee in a clift of the rock, and will cover thee with my hand while I pass by:

EXODUS 33:23

23 And I will take away mine hand, and thou shalt see my back parts: but my face shall not be seen.

I KINGS 7:13

13 ¶ And king Solomon sent and fetched Hiram out of Tyre.

<u>I KINGS 7:14</u>

14 He was a widow's son of the tribe of Naphtali, and his father was a man of Tyre, a worker in brass: and he was filled with wisdom, and understanding, and cunning to work all works in brass. And he came to king Solomon, and wrought all his work.

<u>I KINGS 7:15</u>

15 For he cast two pillars of brass, of eighteen cubits high apiece: and a line of twelve cubits did compass either of them about.

<u>I KINGS 7:16</u>

16 And he made two chapiters of molten brass, to set upon the tops of the pillars: the height of the one chapiter was five cubits, and the height of the other chapiter was five cubits:

<u>I KINGS 7:17</u>

17 And nets of checker work, and wreaths of chain work, for the chapiters which were upon the top of the pillars; seven for the one chapiter, and seven for the other chapiter.

<u>I KINGS 7:18</u>

18 And he made the pillars, and two rows round about upon the one network, to cover the chapiters that were upon the top, with pomegranates: and so did he for the other chapiter.

<u>I KINGS 7:19</u>

19 And the chapiters that were upon the top of the pillars were of lily work in the porch, four cubits.

<u>I KINGS 7:20</u>

20 And the chapiters upon the two pillars had pomegranates also above, over against the belly which was by the network: and the pomegranates were two hundred in rows round about upon the other chapiter.

<u>I KINGS 7:21</u>

21 And he set up the pillars in the porch of the temple: and he set up the right pillar, and called the name thereof Jachin: and he set up the left pillar, and called the name thereof Boaz.

<u>I KINGS 7:22</u>

22 And upon the top of the pillars was lily work: so was the work of the pillars finished.

<u>I KINGS 7:23</u>

23 And he made a molten sea, ten cubits from the one brim to the other: it was round all about, and his height was five cubits: and a line of thirty cubits did compass it round about.

<u>I KINGS 6:21</u>

21 So Solomon overlaid the house within with pure gold: and he made a partition by the chains of gold before the oracle; and he overlaid it with gold.

<u>I KINGS 6:22</u>

22 And the whole house he overlaid with gold, until he had finished all the house: also the whole altar that was by the oracle he overlaid with gold.

Excluding the bronze, and using the average current price of gold, the gold alone of Solomon's temple would have been an astonishing <u>\$194,404,500,000</u>.

The silver would have been \$22,199,076,000. Added together, the gold and silver used along in Solomon's Temple was worth \$216,603,576,000.

I KINGS 8:6

6 And the priests brought in the ark of the covenant of the LORD unto his place, into the oracle of the house, to the most holy place, even under the wings of the cherubims.

I KINGS 8:7

7 For the cherubims spread forth their two wings over the place of the ark, and the cherubims covered the ark and the staves thereof above.

I KINGS 8:8

8 And they drew out the staves, that the ends of the staves were seen out in the holy place before the oracle, and they were not seen without: and there they are unto this day.

I KINGS 8:9

9 There was nothing in the ark save the two tables of stone, which Moses put there at Horeb, when the LORD made a covenant with the children of Israel, when they came out of the land of Egypt.

<u>I KINGS 8:10</u>

10 And it came to pass, when the priests were come out of the holy place, that the cloud filled the house of the LORD,

<u>I KINGS 8:11</u>

11 So that the priests could not stand to minister because of the cloud: for the glory of the LORD had filled the house of the LORD.

I KINGS 8:12

12 ¶ Then spake Solomon, The LORD said that he would dwell in the thick darkness.

MATTHEW 16:18

18 And I say also unto thee, That thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.

ACTS 1:1

1 ¶ The former treatise have I made, O Theophilus, of all that Jesus began both to do and teach,

ACTS 1:2

2 Until the day in which he was taken up, after that he through the Holy Ghost had given commandments unto the apostles whom he had chosen:

ACTS 1:3

3 To whom also he shewed himself alive after his passion by many infallible proofs, being seen of them forty days, and speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God:

ACTS 2:42

42 ¶ And they continued stedfastly in the **apostles' doctrine** and fellowship, and in breaking of bread, and in prayers.

EPHESIANS 2:19

19 Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellowcitizens with the saints, and of the household of God;

EPHESIANS 2:20

20 And are built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief corner stone;

EPHESIANS 2:21

21 In whom all the building fitly framed together groweth unto an holy temple in the Lord:

EPHESIANS 2:22

22 In whom ye also are builded together for an habitation of God through the Spirit.

EPHESIANS 3:5

5 Which in other ages was not made known unto the sons of men, as it is now revealed unto his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit;

II PETER 3:2

2 That ye may be mindful of the words which were spoken before by the **holy prophets**, and of the commandment of us the apostles of the Lord and Saviour:

ACTS 8:14

14 ¶ Now when the **apostles** which were at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had received the word of God, **they SENT unto them Peter and John:**

ACTS 9:26

26 And when Saul was come to Jerusalem, he assayed to join himself to the disciples: but they were all afraid of him, and believed not that he was a disciple.

<u>ACTS 9:27</u>

27 But Barnabas took him, and brought him to the

apostles, and declared unto them how he had seen the Lord in the way, and that he had spoken to him, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus.

<u>ACTS 9:28</u>

28 And he was with them coming in and going out at Jerusalem.

ACTS 9:29

29 And he spake boldly in the name of the Lord Jesus, and disputed against the Grecians: but they went about to slay him.

ACTS 9:30

30 Which when the brethren knew, **THEY** brought him down to Caesarea, **and sent him forth to Tarsus**.

ACTS 11:22

22 Then tidings of these things came unto the ears of the church which was in Jerusalem: and **they sent forth Barnabas**, that he should go as far as Antioch.

ACTS 13:1

1 ¶ Now there were in the church that was at Antioch certain prophets and teachers; as Barnabas, and Simeon that was called Niger, and Lucius of Cyrene, and Manaen, which had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch, and Saul.

ACTS 13:2

2 As they ministered to the Lord, and fasted, the Holy Ghost said, **Separate me Barnabas and Saul for the work** whereunto I have called them.

ACTS 13:3

3 And when they had fasted and prayed, and laid their hands on them, **they sent them away.**

<u>ACTS 14:21</u>

21 And when they had preached the gospel to that city, and had taught many, they returned again to Lystra, and to Iconium, and Antioch,

ACTS 14:22

22 Confirming the souls of the disciples, and exhorting them to continue in the faith, and that we must through much tribulation enter into the kingdom of God.

ACTS 14:23

23 And when they had <u>ordained them elders in every</u> <u>church</u>, and had prayed with fasting, they commended them to the Lord, on whom they believed.

<u>TITUS 1:5</u>

5 ¶ For this cause left I thee in Crete, that thou shouldest set in order the things that are wanting, **and ordain elders in** every city, as I had appointed thee:

<u>TITUS 1:6</u>

6 ¶ If any be ***BLAMELESS**, the husband of one wife, having faithful children not accused of riot or unruly.

BLAMELESS: GREEK LEXICON -- STRONG'S NUMBER 410 anegkletos {an-eng'-klay-tos}

unreprovable, that cannot be called into to account, unaccused,

<u>TITUS 1:7</u>

7 For a bishop **must be blameless**, as the steward of God; not selfwilled, not soon angry, not given to wine, no striker, not given to filthy lucre;

<u>TITUS 1:8</u>

8 But a lover of hospitality, a lover of good men, sober, just, holy, temperate;

<u>TITUS 1:9</u>

9 Holding fast **the faithful word as he hath been taught**, that he may be able by sound doctrine both to exhort and to convince the gainsayers.

ACTS 15:1

1 ¶ And certain men which came down from Judaea taught the brethren, and said, Except ye be circumcised after the manner of Moses, ye cannot be saved.

ACTS 15:2

2 When therefore Paul and Barnabas had no small dissension and disputation with them, they determined that Paul and Barnabas, and certain other of them, **should go up to Jerusalem unto the apostles and elders about this question.**

ACTS 15:3

3 And being brought on their way by the church, they passed through Phenice and Samaria, declaring the conversion of the Gentiles: and they caused great joy unto all the brethren.

ACTS 15:4

4 And when they were come to Jerusalem, **they were received of the church, and of the apostles and elders**, and they declared all things that God had done with them.

ACTS 15:5

5 But there rose up certain of the sect of the Pharisees which believed, saying, That it was needful to circumcise them, and to command them to keep the law of Moses.

ACTS 15:6

6 **¶ And the apostles and elders** came together for to consider of this matter.

ACTS 15:22

22 ¶ Then pleased it **the apostles and elders, with the whole church**, **TO SEND CHOSEN MEN** of their own company to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas; namely, Judas surnamed Barsabas, and Silas, chief men among the brethren:

<u>ACTS 15:23</u>

23 And they wrote letters by them after this manner; **The apostles and elders and brethren** send greeting unto the brethren which are of the Gentiles in Antioch and Syria and Cilicia:

ACTS 15:24

24 Forasmuch as we have heard, that certain **which went out from us** have troubled you with words, subverting your souls, saying, Ye must be circumcised, and keep the law: to whom we gave no such commandment:

ACTS 15:25

25 It seemed good unto us, being assembled with one accord, to send chosen men unto you with our beloved Barnabas and Paul,

ACTS 15:26

26 Men that have hazarded their lives for the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

ACTS 15:27

27 **We have sent** therefore Judas and Silas, who shall also tell you the same things by mouth.

ACTS 15:40

40 And Paul chose Silas, and departed, **being recommended by the brethren** unto the grace of God.

ACTS 15:41

41 And he went through Syria and Cilicia, confirming the churches.

ACTS 16:4

4 And as they went through the cities, they delivered them the decrees for to keep, **that were ordained of the apostles and elders which were at Jerusalem.**

ACTS 16:5

5 And so were the churches established in the faith, and increased in number daily.

ACTS 20:17

17 ¶ And from Miletus he sent to Ephesus, and called the elders of the church.

ACTS 21:18

18 And the day following Paul went in with us unto James; and all **the elders** were present.

ACTS 21:19

19 And when **he had saluted them**, he declared particularly what things God had wrought among the Gentiles by his ministry.

I CORINTHIANS 4:17

17 ¶ For this cause **have I sent unto you Timotheus**, who is my beloved son, and faithful in the Lord, who shall bring you into remembrance of my ways which be in Christ, as I teach everywhere in every church.

II CORINTHIANS 8:16

16 ¶ But thanks be to God, which put the same earnest care into the heart of Titus for you.

II CORINTHIANS 8:17

17 For indeed he accepted the exhortation; but being more forward, of his own accord he went unto you.

II CORINTHIANS 8:18

18 And **we have sent with him** the brother, whose praise is in the gospel throughout all the churches;

II CORINTHIANS 8:19

19 And not that only, **but who was also chosen of the churches to travel with us with this grace,** which is administered by us to the glory of the same Lord, and declaration of your ready mind:

PHILIPPIANS 2:25

25 Yet I supposed it necessary **to send to you Epaphroditus**, my brother, and companion in labor, and fellowsoldier, but your messenger, and he that ministered to my wants.

PHILIPPIANS 2:26

26 For he longed after you all, and was full of heaviness, because that ye had heard that he had been sick.

PHILIPPIANS 2:27

27 For indeed he was sick nigh unto death: but God had mercy on him; and not on him only, but on me also, lest I should have sorrow upon sorrow.

PHILIPPIANS 2:28

28 **I sent him therefore the more carefully**, that, when ye see him again, ye may rejoice, and that I may be the less sorrowful.

PHILIPPIANS 2:29

29 Receive him therefore in the Lord with all gladness; and hold such in reputation:
